Archon arborist we hired after board approval at our February meeting finally showed up by surprise earlier in the month on a very rainy day. It took some time to straighten out our agreed price and get a detailed report from his office but everything is good.

The arborist report is attached. Everyone who was listed by address has been notified of the tree(s) at their address and what needs to be done. Some need trees removed and others just a matter of clearing ivy from trees on their property. Removal of trees or even ivy in greenbelt requires contacting the board of directors with some photos and a letter sent to our official address describing the problem. Same rule we have always had. Removal of trees on private property is the responsibility of the owner(s).

We apparently have a healthy forest [for now] however out of 11 trees that are threatening or pose a future threat problem there are two that require future investigation for location and maybe the responsibility of the association. Otherwise it would appear all the trees are privately owned.

The logging of some trees on private property will take place in the near future and you will receive notification via mail when Archon will be here. That's if we get notified. You can get estimates on your trees on your lot as Archon likes to work one neighborhood at a time so I think we will get a heads up. Remember you can use your own logger on your property and don't need permission. The only thing we may save when we all use the same logger is costs due to a large group.
